

In its 48th year, the Leisure Development Course (LDC) will be partnering with the Recreation Facilities Association of BC (RFABC) to ensure coordination of the LDC will continue to provide park, recreation, culture, and community development personnel with innovative leadership, management, and professional development training.

This three-year certificate-granting curriculum is an intense four-day learning period hosted at the lecture facilities and accommodation at Vance Creek Hotel & Conference Centre on Silver Star Mountain. The design and flexibility of the core curriculum allows the student to enter at the year of his/her convenience – the learner does not have to participate in sequential order. Successful graduates also have the option to apply for post-secondary credits through the Recreation Studies Department at Langara College in Vancouver.
